

Henry Marty

June 20, 1869 - Jan. 4, 1918

Dies Following Operation

Henry Marty, who was operated upon for cancer at the Madison general hospital, passed away at that institution at about 10 o'clock p. m. on Friday of last week, Jan. 4. While his condition was considered critical at the time of the operation, he appeared to be rallying nicely and his chances for recovery appeared to be quite encouraging up to a day or two before his death. The news of his demise, therefore, was a severe shock to his family and friends.

The deceased was born June 20, 1869, at Ellenthal, Canton Of Glarus, Switzerland. He emigrated to this country in 1890 and located at New Glarus. Later he was employed as cheesemaker in the vicinity of Blanchardville and Hollandale, subsequently moving to Monroe, where he was employed in the condensery for a period of four years. The family moved to Monticello several weeks ago and Mr. Marty was employed in the condensery up to Dec. 23, when the condition of his health became such that he was compelled to give up his work and seek relief in an operation. The deceased was married to Miss Magdalena Schiesser on Sept. 17, 1905, who, together with one son and daughter, survive him. Two children, both girls, died in early childhood. He is also survived by his aged mother, still living in Switzerland, and three brothers in this country.

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon from Gerber's undertaking parlors and later from the German Reformed church, the Rev, A, Muehlmeier officiating. The deceased was a member of the Monroe G. U. G. G. and several members of the order were here to attend the funeral.
