## Rosina Marty March 23, 1885 – March 1934 Mrs, Rosina Marty Dies in Madison at Age of 48 Years Final Rites For Native of Monticello Conducted Here Tuesday

Final rites for Mrs. Rosina M. Marty, 49 years of age, Madison, a native of Monticello and practically her lifetime a resident of this community, who died at 1:30 o'clock Saturday afternoon in the Madison hospital after having been in failing health for nearly three years, were conducted at 1:30 Tuesday afternoon here in the home of her father, Andrew Bontly, and at 2 in the local Reformed church.

The services were performed by Rev. A. Muehlmeier, pastor of the Monticello Reformed church, and Rev. Calvin Zenk, pastor of the Memorial Reformed church of Madison. The remains of Mrs. Marty were interred in Highland cemetery.

A native of Washington township, Rosina M. Bontly was born March 23, 1885, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Bontly. She was united in marriage to Edward Marty of New Glarus in February, 1903. For a number of years following their marriage, the couple engaged in farming in Washington township, later retiring and moving to Monticello to take up their residence. Mr. Marty passed away Aug. 10, 1926. Several years ago, Mrs. Marty and her two sons, Andrew and Walter, moved to Madison.

Mrs. Marty was affiliated with the Memorial Reformed church of Madison. She was a woman of many commendable qualities, and the uncomplaining and cheerful manner in which she endured the pain and discomfiture of her long illness. was characteristic of her nature. Her radiant and sunny disposition will long be remembered by her numerous friends and acquaintances.

The deceased is survived by two sons, Andrew and Walter, both of Madison; her father, Andrew Bontly, Monticello; two brothers, Edward A. Bontly, Monticello, and Wilbert A. Bontly, Madison; and one sister, Mrs. Ralph A. Bast, Grand Forks, N. D. Her mother, Mrs. Andrew Bontly, died suddenly and unexpectedly in her home here only a few weeks ago.
