Mrs. Emma Moore Buried in Madison

Final Rites Conducted for Aged Monticello Resident

Funeral services for Mrs. Emma Moore, aged Monticello lady, who passed away in the Charles Youngreen home Sunday morning following a period of ill health which had its inception some months ago, were conducted at 1:30 Tuesday afternoon in the Voegeli funeral home. Rev. A. Muehlmeier, former pastor of the Reformed church, officiated. Burial was in Forest Hill cemetery, Madison.

Fractured Leg

Mr. Moore had been cared for at the Charles Clark home for a number of months last fall. During recent weeks, however, she had made her home with Mr. and Mrs. Chas. Youngreen. About two years ago she suffered the misfortune of fracturing a hip and spent several months in a hospital. This injury left her in a more or less helpless condition and she was not able to get around without assistance. A number of days before her death she broke a leg and she failed quickly. A blood clot in a lung was given as a contributing factor of her death.

Washington Native

Emma Schlittler was born in Washington township on the farm now owned by Blum Brothers, a short distance northwest of the village. In 1916 she was united in marriage to Leslie Moore. The couple made their home on a farm in Exeter township for many years. Mr. Moore passed away a number of years ago.

Survivors are three sisters, Mrs. Emil Baireuther and Mrs. Goesch, Milwaukee, and Mrs. Betty Lettigon, Sheboygan Falls. She was preceded, in death by her husband, her parents, one brother and one sister.
