Samuel Moser, 77, former Washington Township, rural Monticello, resident died on Monday, April 23, 1984, at Madison General Hospital,

He was born on December 31, 1907, in Canton Bern, Switzerland, the son of John and Marie Inabnit Moser. He came to the United States at the age of two with his parents.

On June 11, 1938, he was married to Sylvia Wild. He made cheese in the Mineral Point area before moving to the Red Oak, Ill., area where he farmed until 1954. He then farmed in Washington Township for several more years. After he quit farming, he was employed at the Chalet Cheese Co-op, Monroe, before his retirement.
