

Martin B. Neville
Mar. 20, 1891 – Sept. 23, 1926

Martin B. Neville, who had been seriously ill for four months, passed away at 5:45 last Thursday morning at St. Mary's hospital, Madison,

He was born March 20, 1891, in Brooklyn township, Green county, where he lived with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Patrick Neville, until his marriage to Miss Theresa Dooly, of Monticello, which occurred on Feb. 11, 1915.

Following their marriage the couple bought a farm near Brodhead, where they made their home until last December. At that time, owing to Mr. Neville's poor health, they sold their farm and personal property. In February of this year they bought a home at 724 Vine street, Beloit, and moved to that city.

Mr. Neville was taken seriously ill on May 22, his condition being such that he was immediately taken to the Beloit General hospital. Following an operation for ruptured ulcers of the stomach, he appeared to be getting along nicely for a period of three weeks, when he again began to fail, due to the formation of abscesses in the abdomen.

He was taken to St. Mary's hospital, Madison, on August 18, where he was the subject of two more major operations and three blood transfusions, but all to no avail. He was very patient through all his suffering.

Mr. Neville was courteous, and affable as a neighbor, an honorable and worthy citizen, and, above all, a man who was closely devoted to his home and family.

He is survived by his wife and daughter, Gertrude, aged 7 years, his parents, two sisters, three brothers, and a host of other relatives and friends.

His remains were brought to Monticello and taken to the home of his father-in-law, James Dooly, where they remained until Saturday morning, when funeral services were held at St. Patrick's Catholic church, Albany, at 10 o'clock a. m.

A large number of relatives and friends were present at the last sad rites, and many beautiful floral tributes were in evidence.
