

Louise Pagel

Oct. 6, 1838 – April 1918

Mrs. Frederick Pagel, a resident of Green county since 1868, died at her home in Monroe at 8 o'clock yesterday morning, following an illness with paralysis and old age complications. The deceased had been in failing health for the past six years, but it was only during the past six weeks that her condition was considered serious,

Louise Hartwig was born in Pommering, Germany, Oct. 6, 1838. On April 3, 1861, she was married to Frederick Pagel and the couple came to America on July 3, 1868. They first located at Juda but later moved to a farm in Sylvester township, where they lived for over thirty years. Seven years ago they moved to Monroe.

Besides her husband, the deceased is survived by five children — Mrs. Lena Baird, of Oshkosh; Mrs. Nicholas Luchsinger, of Monticello; Frank Pagel, of Afton; Wm. Pagel, of Sylvester, and Miss Marie Pagel, at home. Twenty-one grandchildren and thirteen great-grandchildren also survive. Four children preceded her in death.

The deceased was a woman of kindly disposition and was held in high esteem by all who knew her. Her death removes one who will be greatly missed by relatives and friends alike. Funeral services will be held Thursday afternoon at 1 o'clock at the home and at 1:30 at the Emmanuel Evangelical church, Rev. A. A. Krug officiating. Burial will be in the Dutch Hollow cemetery.
