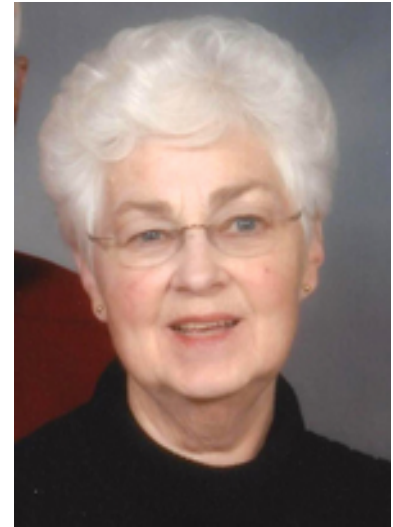


Karen Marie (Pitterle) Roe

Karen M. (Pitterle) Roe, age 75 of Monticello, died peacefully in the Monroe Clinic Hospital on July 6, 2017. She was born on February 1, 1942, in Brazil, Indiana to Robert and Ruth (Hesselman) Pitterle. After graduating from Whitewater High School in 1960, she began working at the local phone company as a switchboard operator until she married Donald, her high school sweetheart, in 1962. Her children remember her as a kind and supportive mother and grandmother with a great sense of humor who encouraged them to pursue their goals and passions. She was an active member of the Zwingli United Church of Christ in Monticello. She loved baking for her family and friends, gardening, bird watching and following the Packers and Wisconsin Badgers sports teams.
