

Paul Ruenger, 57, Dies Monday Nite Of Heart Attack

Paul Ruenger, 57 years of age, Mt. Pleasant township, died suddenly at 9 Monday evening of a heart attack suffered at the farm home of his nephew, Herman Schulz, where he made his home and assisted with the farm work,

Mr. Ruenger was born in Norrenberg, Germany, April 14, 1898. He came to the United States in 1923 and was employed on farms in the Monticello and New Glarus areas since coming to this country. He had lived at the Schulz home for the past four years.

An unusually jovial and friendly individual, Paul always had a big smile upon meeting any of his many friends in this vicinity. News of his sudden passing was received with deep regret by his friends in the community.

He is survived by his nephew; four nieces, Mrs. Dale Atkinson and Mrs. Harold Albertson, Albany, Mrs. Howard Gould, Belleville, and Mrs. Lawrence Huntley, Monticello. He was preceded in death by two brothers and one sister in Germany and one sister, Mrs. Albert Schulz, Monticello, in 1950.
