Mrs. Albert Rufer Expires in Monroe

Dane County Native Dies After Illness of Nearly Two Years

Funeral services for Mrs. Albert Rufer, 41 years of age, who passed away early Thursday morning in the home of Ulrich Rufer, 912 Ninth street, Monroe, after an illness of several years, were conducted at 12:30 p. m Sunday in the Shriner-Nueschwander funeral home, Monroe, and at 1:30 in the Washington township German Reformed church. Mrs. Rufer had been bed-fast for over a year.

Rev. A. Muehlmeier, Monticello, pastor of the church, officiated at the services. Burial was in the Washington township cemetery.

Native of Dane County

Mrs. Rufer was a native of Dane county, having been born March 24, 1895, the daughter of John and Mary Loertscher Gempeler. She was united in marriage to Albert Rufer Jan. 27, 1916 in Monticello, and until a short time ago she lived on the home farm in Jordan township.

Mrs. Rufer was a member of the Reformed church, Washington township. She was also a member of the Ladies' Aid society of the Reformed church, and was confirmed in Monticello in 1910.

Survivors, besides the widower, are one son, Marvin, at home; her mother, Mrs. Mary Gempeler, Monticello; two sisters, Mrs. Will Rufer, Monroe township, and Mrs. Isaac Babler, Clarno township; five brothers, John Gempeler, Monticello; Edward and Albert Gempeler, Washington township; Herman, Albany, and Henry, Monroe. She was preceded in-death by two brothers and one sister.
