

ADAM SCHULER

September 12, 1900 - July 2, 1977

Adam A. Schuler, 76, 601 N. Midvale Blvd., Madison, died Saturday afternoon, July 2, 1977, at the Methodist Hospital, Madison. He was born on a farm in Washington Township, September 12, 1900. His parents were Jacob and Varana Zweifel Schuler. He graduated from Monticello High School in 1918. He was married May 22, 1931, at the Monticello Zwingli Parsonage by the late Dr. Albert Muehlmeier, to the former Lona E. Disch. Mr. Schuler taught school for several years in the Monticello area and later established a general insurance agency which he conducted in Monticello until his retirement in 1962. He had been a Madison resident since 1963.

Survivors include his wife, two sons, Donald A. Schuler, Walnut, California, and Ralph A. Schuler, San Diego, one daughter, Mrs. Dieter (Beth) Berninger, Moorhead, Minn., one sister, Mrs. A.W. (Louise) Becker, Madison, and eight grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents, two brothers in infancy, two sisters, Mrs. Rose Panzer, and Mrs. Lena Bontly, one brother, Gilbert, 1966, and one grandson, David Berninger, 1970.

Schuler was a member of the Zwingli United Church of Christ in Monticello. Since moving to Madison had been a member of the Memorial United Church of Christ. He is a member of the Monticello Masonic Lodge and the Madison Scottish Rite Bodies. He is also an honorary member of the Monticello Volunteer Fire Department. He served as secretary of the fire department from 1932 to 1957, and was village clerk from 1936 until 1963. Funeral services were conducted Wednesday, July 6, 1:30 p.m. at the Zwingli United Church of Christ, Rev. Jon C. Schultz, pastor of the Memorial United Church of Christ officiated. Interment will be at Highland Cemetery, Monticello. Masonic services were conducted Tuesday evening.
