**April 9, 1872 - March 19, 1946**

### **Mrs. August Schultz Dies Tuesday; Rites Planned Friday P.M.**

Esteemed Local Resident Expires at 73 Years After Extended Illness

The body of Mrs. August Schultz, 73 years of age, well known and highly esteemed resident of Monticello for nearly 25 years, was found in an upstairs room at about 6 o'clock Tuesday morning by her son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Elmer Schwerin, with whom she had been making her home.

Mrs. Schultz had been in failing health for the past three years and seemed despondent since the death of her husband in 1944.

Barbara was a native of New Glarus township, having been born April 9, 1872, the daughter of Jacob and Sarah Blumer Freitag. She attended the Legler rural school near her home and on Oct. 25, 1894, she was united in marriage to August Schultz. Until 1905 the couple operated the homestead farm in Mt. Pleasant township, now owned by Albert Schultz, moving that year to a farm a short distance west of Attica, now owned by a son, William Schultz. They retired from farming in 1922 and moved to Monticello, where they had since made their home. Mr. Schultz passed away June 29, 1944.

Mrs. Schultz was a member of the Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church, Monticello.

Mrs. Schultz is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Elmer Schwerin, Monticello; two sons, Emil, Evansville, and William Albany; four grandchildren; three brothers, Henry F. Freitag, Chicago, and John and Jacob, Monroe; and five sisters, Mrs. Henry Friday, Dakota City, Iowa, Mrs. Jacob Legler, Monroe, Mrs. Anna Walker, Renwick, Iowa, and Mrs. Jacob Rhyner, Sr., Albany, and Mrs. Fred J. Allenman, Tacoma, Wash. Besides her husband and parents, Mrs. Schultz was preceded in death by a brother, Rudy Freitag, Monticello.

### **Funeral Services Friday**

The body is at the Voegeli funeral home and will be removed to the Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church at noon Friday. Funeral services will be conducted at the church at 2 Friday afternoon. The Rev. A. R. Achtemeier, church pastor, will officiate, and burial will be in Highland cemetery.
