

Lyle E. Sinnett
July 18, 1922 - April 22, 1984

Lyle E. Sinnett, 61, 221 S. Pierce, Monticello, died Sunday, April 22, 1984, at the VA Hospital, Madison, where he had been a patient since April 16.

He was born July 18, 1922, in Evansville, the son of Edward and Cora (Weaver) Sinnett. He married Marion Moser June 17, 1944, at the Zwingli United Church of Christ. Mr. Sinnett attended Evansville schools; he had lived in Monticello since his discharge from the service in 1947. He was a sample speaker engineer at Oaktron Industries, Monroe, until his retirement in 1979.

Mr. Sinnett was a World War II veteran. He was inducted at Milwaukee on Oct. 19, 1942, and discharged Jan. 22, 1947, from the Percy Jones General Hospital, Ft. Custer, Mich. He was a sergeant in the tank battalion and earned the following: European African Middle Eastern Theater Ribbon; two Bronze Service Stars; Purple Heart; Good Conduct Medal; American Theater Ribbon. He was wounded in action in Belgium on Jan. 5, 1945.

He was a member of the Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello; the Amsiutz-Marty American Legion Post 256 of Monticello; and a lifetime member of the Wisconsin Chapter of Disable American Veterans.

He is survived by his wife, Marion; two sons, Robert L., Dallas, Texas, and Dean W., Monticello; one daughter, Susan K. Sinnett, Madison; and one grandson.

He was preceded in death by his parents; four half-brothers, Lloyd, Floyd, Lester and Robert Gleason; and one half-sister, Mrs. Beatrice Wood.

Funeral services will be held at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday at Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello, the Rev. Charles G. Workman officiating, followed by military rites in Highland Cemetery.

Friends may call after 6 p.m. Tuesday in the Zwingli Church Memorial Lounge and Wednesday in the church sanctuary until the time of services.
