Monticello Native

Anna Baebler was born in Monticello Feb. 11, 1889, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Peter Baebler. About 26 years ago she was united in marriage to Charles Snyder, who passed away about 10 years ago. For a number of years preceding Mr. Snyder's death she assisted her husband in conducting a restaurant in Monticello. For the past two years or more she had made her home in Janesville.

Ill Many Months

Several years ago Mrs. Snyder had the misfortune of fracturing a hip and at that time spent several months in a Madison hospital. However, she failed to regain her former strength and her injured hip did not function as before. She had been bedfast for the past several months and entered a Madison hospital about 10 days before her death.

She is survived by two sons, Charles and Donald, Janesville; two sisters, Mrs. John Buehler, Orangeville, and Mrs. Lloyd Clark, near Juda; and one brother, P. J. Baebler, Monroe.

Her father died in 1901 and her mother passed away at the home of her daughter at Orangeville Feb, 23 of this year.
