

Death Angel Comes to Relief of Aged Lady, After Extended Illness.

Nov 3, 1849 - Dec 20, 1907

Mrs. Katharina Stauffer nee Haggmann, wife of Nicolaus Stauffer, passed away at her home in Mt. Pleasant township at mid-night on Friday last, after an extended illness. She suffered from consumption and for a number of weeks her condition had been such that she was unable to leave her bed.

The deceased was married in 1872 to Tok. Bagg, who, as well as an only daughter, Mrs, S. J. Luchsinger, preceded her in death. She was married to the husband who survives her in 1892, and the couple came to this country the same year, settling on a farm in Mt. Pleasant township. Besides the aged husband, she also leaves to mourn her death four sons and one daughter, as follows: Robert, Emil, Edward, Axel and Mrs. Math. Marty, all residents of this vicinity.

The funeral services were held at the German Reformed church yesterday (Monday) afternoon, conducted by the pastor, Rev. Carl Heyl, and were attended by a large concourse of sympathizing neighbors and friends of the family.

The remains of Mrs. Stauffer were the first to be interred in the new Highland cemetery, just south of the village and the consecration and dedication of the new cemetery was performed by the Rev. Heyl in accordance with the ritual of the Reformed church.
