

Lydia Voegeli

MONTICELLO—Mrs. Lydia M. Voegeli, 88, formerly of Monticello, died Tuesday, Sept. 6, 1988, at the New Glarus Home, where she had been a resident since January.

She was born Feb. 16, 1900, to Fred and Caroline (Theiler) Blum on the Blum homestead farm in Washington Township in Green County.

She attended Marty rural schools. She married Walter E. Voegeli Oct 21, 1920. After their marriage, they farmed on the Voegeli farm in Washington Township near Monticello. Her husband died in 1939.

Mrs. Voegeli moved in 1955 to Monticello, where she was employed by the Monticello School District in the hot lunch program until 1972.

Survivors include a son, Richard W. Voegeli of New Glarus; a daughter, Mrs. H. Warren (Caroline) Ingram of Madison; four grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

In addition to her husband, she was preceded in death by her mother in 1924 and her father in 1941; a sister, Louise Wild, in 1980, and four brothers, Arthur in 1926, Fred in 1957, Robert in 1970 and Herman in 1984.

She was a member of Zwingli United Church of Christ, the Ladies Aid Society and the Fellowship Circle and a member of the G.U.G.G. Lodge.

Funeral services are 11 a.m. Friday at the Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello, with the Rev. Erwin H. Pegel officiating. Interment is in Highland Cemetery.

Visitation is after 6 pm. Thursday in the Zwingli Church memorial lounge and after 9 a.m. Friday until the time of services in the church sanctuary.

A memorial fund is being established. Voegeli Funeral Service is in charge of arrangements.
