

Mrs. Theresa Voegeli Dies Suddenly; Services Sunday

A well-known Monroe woman, Mrs. Alfred Voegeli, 79, of 2109 14th St., Monroe, died unexpectedly at 9:30 pm. Wednesday, July 1, 1970, of an apparent heart attack in her home. She had been uncomfortable during the day, however, and had had the doctor.

The former Theresa Marie Bontly was born in Monticello May 23, 1891, a daughter of John and Mary Mitchell Bontly. She attended Monticello schools and was married June 14, 1911 in her parental home to Alfred Voegeli.

They moved to Monroe in 1926. Mr. Voegeli was a well known furniture store owner-operator in Monroe for many years. He had also had a service station.

Mrs. Voegeli was a member of St. John's United Church of Christ and its Aid Society, a 50-year member of St. Omar Chapter, Order of Eastern Star, and a member of the GUG Germania Society and the Victory Homemakers of Monroe.

Surviving are her husband; two daughters, Mrs. Willard (Josephine) Waeffler, Evansville, and Mrs. Nathan A. (Helen) Theiler, Monroe; two sisters, Mrs. Edith Jensen, Richland Center and Mrs. Edward J. (Rita) Konkol, Madison; four grandchildren, and two great-grandsons.

She was preceded in death by a brother, William E. Bontly, in 1941; a sister, Mrs. Ernest (Sylvia) Dolfen in 1968; her father, in 1935 and her mother, 1940.

Funeral services for Mrs. Voegeli will be at 2 pm. Sunday, July 5, in St. John's United Church of Christ of Monroe. Burial will be in Highland Cemetery, Monticello.
