Mary Wendler, Age 20, Dies; Services Held Here Saturday

Funeral services for Miss Mary Wendler, 20 years of age, formerly of Monticello, who died early on Wednesday of last week in her apartment in Monroe were held at 1:30 Saturday afternoon at the Zwingli Unite Church of Christ here.

The Rev. Charles G. Workman, church pastor, officiated and burial was in Hillcrest cemetery, Albany. Pallbearer were Adolph Gobeli, Zane Zurbuchen and Donald Hoesly, Monticello; Ron Gobeli, Browntown: William Hogan, Argyle, and William Brecklin, Mukwonago.

Miss Wendler's death apparently occurred suddenly and unexpectedly. Her death was discovered early Wednesday morning in the bathroom of her apartment by her roommate Miss Christine Gempeler.

Monroe police were called and reported there was no evidence of foul play. It was established that death was due to natural causes.

Mary Ann Wendler was born in Monroe on Oct. 7, 1950, the daughter of Clarence M. and Vivian Dame Wendler. She was graduated from the Monroe high school in 1969 and had lived in Monroe while working at Green County Pre-Pak for the past year and a half.

She is survived by her father and step-mother, Monticello; brother John Wendler, Monticello; a step-brother, Irving. J Kubly, Monticello, and 2 two step sisters, Mrs. William Brecklin, Mukwonago, and Mrs William Hogan, Argyle.

She was preceded in death by her mother on Nov. 13, 1961, and a brother, David, in infancy.

An autopsy was conducted with Green County Coroner Richard Wagner in charge.
