HOLD RITES FOR AGED RESIDENT ON SUNDAY P. M.

Mrs. Marie Wittenwyler Dies After Long Illness

Following a period of ill health which extended over the past several years, Mrs. Marie Wittenwyler, 79 years of age, for many years a resident of Monticello, passed away around 5 o'clock last Wednesday afternoon in her home here. The funeral services were conducted at 1:30 Sunday afternoon in the home and at 2 in the Evangelical church. The Rev. G. Theo. Vieth, pastor of the church, conducted the services. Interment was in Highland cemetery.

A native of Germany, Marie Krueger was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Krueger, whom she accompanied to this country when only five years old, the family taking up their residence at Two Rivers. Her marriage to Jacob Wittenwyler took place June 9, 1868 at Black Wolf, this state.

The couple came to Monticello from that section, settling in Washington township. Thirty-eight years ago they moved to the village to reside. Mrs. Wittenwyler was born in Mecklenburg, Germany, Oct. 10, 1852. Her husband died a number of years ago.

Survivors are two daughters, Mrs. John Schoenenberger, Janesville, and Mrs. Joe Baldwin, Monroe; two sons, John, Brooklyn, and Matt B., Monticello; two sisters, Mrs. Fred Rausch, Two Rivers, and Mrs. Emma Schroeder, Sheboygan; 14 grandchildren, and eight great-grandchildren.
