

Robert E. Woodruff

ALAMO, Calif. — Funeral services were held Feb. 21 at Lafayette-Orinda Presbyterian Church, Lafayette, Calif, for Dr. Robert E. Woodruff, 38, of Alamo, Calif, who died Saturday, Feb. 15, 1986, at Incline Village, Nev. Dr. Woodruff was an anesthesiologist.

He was born in Monroe June 22, 1947, to Dr. and Mrs. Raymond A. Woodruff, now of Monticello. He graduated from Monticello High School in 1965. He was senior class president and Salutatorian.

He earned a bachelor of science degree from the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater, graduating magna cum laude. He was a member of Beta Beta Beta, Lambda Chi Alpha and Phi Kappa Phi. He graduated from the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine with honors in 1973. He joined the Navy in 1972 and served his internship and residency at the Oak Knoll Regional Medical Center, Oakland, Calif, where he did research and lectured at seminars. When he left Oak Knoll he was chief of the anesthesiology department. He was on the staff at Merritt Hospital, Oakland, for 10 years and was an active staff member of John Muir Hospital, Walnut Creek, Calif. Dr. Woodruff was a member of the American Medical Association, C.M.A., A.C.C.M.A., C.S.A. and the American Legion Post 256 of Monticello.

He is survived by his wife, Terri; two daughters, Whitney and Ashley; his parents, Dr. and Mrs. Raymond A. Woodruff, Monticello; three brothers, John, Madison; Dr. Kenneth Woodruff and Dr. Donald Woodruff, both of La Crosse; and three sisters, Shirley Hill, Claremore, Okla.; Judith Blanchard, Houston, Texas; and Heidi Sydnor, Middleton.

Jim Little, pastor, officiated at the Feb. 21 funeral services. Internment was at Oakmont Cemetery, Lafayette, Calif.
