FINAL RITES FOR LOCAL LADY, 45, THIS AFTERNOON
Kathryn Zimmerman Dies Following Long Illness

Funeral services for Miss Kathryn Zimmerman, aged 45, a native of Monticello and a resident of this community her entire lifetime, who passed away here Tuesday morning in the home of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Zimmerman, will be conducted at 2 o'clock this afternoon in the Reformed church. Rev. A. Muehlmeier, pastor of the church, will have charge of the services. Interment will be in Highland cemetery.

Miss Zimmerman was born in Monticello on Nov. 1, 1886, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Zimmerman. She attended the local schools and had always resided at home.

Early in life Miss Zimmerman was overtaken by ill health, and despite the fact that she was provided the very best of medical care, the nature of her affliction was beyond successful treatment. Through all the years of her poor health, Miss Zimmerman accepted her affliction uncomplainingly and her cheerfulness in view of her illness was remarkable. She was a woman of many exemplary traits, always willing to contribute her share to any noteworthy endeavor. Miss Zimmerman was affiliated with the Reformed church.

Besides the parents, Miss Zimmerman is survived by five sisters, Mrs. Henry E. Babler, Mount Pleasant township; Mrs. Henry C. Elmer, Washington township; Mrs. L. A. Voegeli, Monticello; Mrs. C. A. Eckberg, Plymouth, and Mrs. Fred Haddinger, Fort Atkinson.

For the past several months, the nature of Miss Zimmerman's illness was such that she was confined to bed. She was also under the care of a trained nurse during that time.
