M.R. Zimmerman Dies

A retired heating and plumbing businessman, Marvin R. Zimmerman, 71, died at 12:15 a.m. Wednesday, April 15, 1970, in St. Mary's Hospital after being stricken while participating in the Euchre League at Paoli. A stomach hemorrhage caused his death.

Mr. Zimmerman was succeeded in the business by his son, Dean, in 1964, after 32 years of operations.

He was born Sept. 17, 1898 on the Zimmerman Homestead farm in New Glarus Township, a son of David and Verena Becker Zimmerman. He attended rural schools and was confirmed in Swiss Church at New Glarus in 1914. On June 26, 1924 he was married at Madison to Elma Remy.

Mr. Zimmerman was a member of Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello and the Monticello Union Masonic Lodge, and was an honorary member of the Monticello Fire Department. Mr. Zimmerman had served as Monticello municipal justice, resigning in September 1967.

He had learned the heating-plumbing trade with Sam Luchsinger then started his own contracting business in 1924.

Surviving are: a son, Dean R., and a granddaughter, Jean Marie Zimmerman, both of Monticello and two sisters, Mrs. Edwin (Fannie) Hustad, Mt. Horeb, and Mrs. Jacob (Emma) Luchsinger, New Glarus.

His wife died Jan. 4, 1964; his father, 1935; his mother, 1937; a sister, Mrs. John (Anna) Eichelkraut in 1962, and three brothers, Fred in 1941; David, 1944, and John in 1951.

Funeral services for Mr. Zimmerman will be at 2 p.m. Saturday, April 18, in Zwingli Church, with his pastor, Rev. J. Allan Mittler, officiating. Burial is to be in Highland Cemetery.

Friends may call at the Memorial Lounge of Zwingli Church from 4 to 9 p.m. Friday. Masonic rites, by the Monticello Lodge, will be at 8:30 p.m.
