Mrs. Thos. Zweifel Passes; Rites Held

Washington Twp. Citizen Succumbs to Heart Attack

Funeral services for Mrs. Thos. Zweifel, 71 years of age, life-long resident of Washington township, who passed away at about 4 o'clock Saturday morning following a stroke and a heart attack, were conducted at 1:30 Monday afternoon in the home of a son, Nick K. Zweifel, New Glarus, and at 2 in the New Glarus Evangelical and Swiss Reformed church.

Rev. Richard Rettig, church pastor, officiated. Burial was in the Reformed cemetery, New Glarus. Six nephews were pallbearers, as follows: William Engler, Wilbert Zweifel, Lloyd Babler, Ernest Zentner and Nick Zentner, New Glarus, and Casper Zentner, Jr., Belleville.

Suffered Stroke

Mrs. Zweifel had been in poor health since February when she suffered a stroke, which occurred two days after she and her husband celebrated their golden wedding anniversary, which took place on Feb. 7.

Washington Native

Anna Marie Zentner was born in Washington township Sept. 6, 1867, a daughter of Nickalus and Euphemia Elmer Zentner. She was united in marriage to Thomas Zweifel Feb. 7, 1889, the ceremony being performed by the late Rev. E. T. Etter, New Glarus. The couple settled on a farm in Washington township about seven miles west of Monticello, where they have continued to make their home.

A Severe Shock

The sudden and unexpected death of Mrs. Zweifel brought sincere regret to her large circle of friends and acquaintances. Not only was Mrs. Zweifel a devoted wife and mother but an ideal neighbor as well, who was always held in the highest esteem by her many friends and neighbors.

Survivors besides the bereaved widower are two sons, Herman and Nick K., New Glarus; one granddaughter, Mrs. Vernon Duerst, Monticello; two grandsons, Earl Zweifel, Chicago, and Arthur Zweifel, New Glarus; five great-grandchildren; one sister, Mrs. Henry Z. Duerst; and two brothers, W. L. Zentner and Casper Zentner, New Glarus. A daughter, Mrs. Scott Hilton, New Glarus, passed away in 1937. One son died in infancy.
